January 3, 2018

President John Mory called the EN Band Boosters meeting to order. 16 Present

Director's Report: Mr. Bryan Muñoz: Grant opportunity: East Noble Bands have received a matching grant from the Cole Foundation to help offset the loss of the season. The grant is up to a \$5000 match, meaning every dollar we raise through fundraising will be matched, potentially earning us \$10,000. We have already raised \$1500 from donations, plus \$698 from the cookie walk so we are at \$2200. Only \$2800 to go to complete our goal of \$5000. We would love to see this happen.

January 30th is our Grace College pep game. We will take 45 students only to play. WP **will not** have practice that night. WG **will** have practice.

Mr. Muñoz will use school money to purchase a tarp for one of the winter groups this year to help save money. WP will have a raised tarp as a part of their props.

Question raised: WG fees are only \$450 per student, but it costs more money than that in guard expenses for the winter season. How is this paid?

Response: Fundraising is done to help offset the extra cost of guard, but funds from other programs are also used. WG fees were raised the additional \$50 to help offset some of the costs.

California trip is set to go.

We have \$3633 available cash, with \$8220 in outstanding debt from marching season. We must keep this money for change for the invitational.

Small Claims update: Collection letters equaling \$6000 were sent and still have \$3000 to file on.

Letters have been sent as a final notice prior to filing with small claims. We will file a waiver to offset the cost of filing, but if any fees are accrued in the filing, those fees will be added to the claim. If you are making any attempts to pay on your account we will waive the filing.

Only 6 guard have made their first payment toward the season. Only 12 percussion have made their first payment. These fees need paid to continue paying for props, tarps, flags, uniforms, etc. If you are having trouble paying your account, please contact a board member. We will be happy to establish a payment plan that fits your needs.

Trustee report:

Updates: Trailer estimates for repairs:

\$2400 and \$875. Trying to get a temporary DOT passed inspection so we can use the trailer for the winter season and then repairs can be made over the spring and summer months.

Pete Moga is still working on the details of the repairs and will present written estimates.

Trustees would like to have lighting in the bull pen so it would be easier to park the semi-trailer at night. This must be approved by the school.

White trailer needs to be cleaned out so guard can start using it. Pete Moga stated he will take care of this.
